
## FLEX + Google Slides Tutorial

This tutorial provides step-by-step instructions for downloading resources, assessments, or lesson plans and inserting them into Google Slides. These instructions share how to place an image of a FLEX file into a Google Slide as a reference and also how to hyperlink a PDF from a Google Slide for easy downloadable access.



Select a resource by clicking on it.

When the download opens a new window, select the download icon (a downward arrow with a line underneath it) in the upper right-hand portion of the screen.






To insert an image into Google Slides, the file cannot be a PDF. Create a screenshot of the image to solve this challenge.

Press **COMMAND + -** to reduce the image size until it fits on the screen.


Press **SHIFT + COMMAND + 4** to select the desired area of the screen.








If students will need to download the file, add a text box instructing them to do so.





Return to the Google Drive folder where the FLEX files were originally uploaded and stored. Right click on a file to select **GET SHARABLE LINK**.









Be sure that the shared settings are accurate.

Select **COPY LINK** from the light blue box on the right.







Paste the hyperlink in the pop-up box and select **APPLY**.

The FLEX document will now appear as a resource image on the left and a hyperlink to download the PDF document on the right.
