 <p><i>Jar, Late Jōmon period (ca. 2500-1000 B.C.), H. 7 7/8 in. (20 cm); Diam. 6 1/2 in.</i></p>			<p>Asabachi: Shallow and low-depth clay pots</p> <p>Hachi: Pots with a more moderate depth</p>
 <p><i>"Flame-rimmed" deep bowl (kaen doki), Middle Jomon period (ca. 3500-2500 B.C.), H. 13 in.</i></p>			<p>Sara: Very shallow vessels; reminiscent of a plate or platter</p> <p>Tsubo: Narrow-mouthed vessels with long necks</p>
 <p><i>Deep Vessel, Middle Jōmon period (ca. 3500-2500 B.C.), H. 27 1/2 in.</i></p>			<p>Chuko: A vessel with a spout</p>
